A Snapshot of JobNet

It was the start of a beautiful morning at JobNet. The clients were focused on their individual sessions with their career coaches. “What a study in contrasts,” was the comment from Tim, a JobNet Career Coach, at the end of his morning of coaching two individuals. One coaching meeting was for mock interviewing with an established professional business leader and the other coaching meeting involved creating a resume for a personal caregiver.

You may be surprised to learn that over 70% of clients’ served at JobNet are over the age of 40, and exactly 37% of JobNet clients have degrees. Of those individuals, 12% have advanced degrees.



Job search for the older worker is a scary phase of life to embark upon. The concern over health insurance, paying bills like rent or mortgage, retirement, the responsibility of caring for older parents, and loss of social network has its effect and can lead to depression. JobNet works to provide an environment conducive to the individual increasing his or her skills and confidence as well as feeling optimistic about the future.

One job seeker, *Debra*, wrote, “I was out of my comfort zone the first day I walked into CCSC, but everyone there did whatever they could to build up my confidence and support me. All the workshops were helpful, and the instructors were kind, funny and patient. They truly want you to succeed.” She shared this testimonial after landing her dream job as a floral and interior designer.

Some of CCSC’s programs like rental assistance are zip code restricted; however, JobNet is not a zip code restricted program. People come from the Houston surrounding areas such as Humble, Cypress and Richmond and most are referred by community organization partners.



CCSC’s JobNet is a career-oriented hub focused on meeting the needs of job seekers searching for employment. At JobNet, you can count on getting assistance with all things career or job search related from offering job leads to helping you identify

Dear CCSC Friend,

I spent a morning last fall at the University of Houston's Eye Institute, observing CCSC's Louise J. Moran Vision Care program in action. This program gives needy children professional eye exams by an optometry student along with a pair glasses, if needed. The optometry students are terrific with the children, and the children are fun to watch when they select their frames.



I was especially drawn to a kindergarten boy who had the wiggles: he could not sit still, like most young boys. His father was a parent chaperone, and I ended up having a long conversation with him. The father is raising his four children by himself because his wife walked out on them. The children range in age from the kindergartener to a high school freshman. The oldest helps out a lot, as do his mother and

sister, so he's grateful for his family. Yet he is still the single parent to four children.

He works in a support position, so I imagine his modest income must be barely enough to take care of his family of five. We talked about raising children, boys with the wiggles, Hurricane Harvey, and a variety of other topics. I told him how impressed I was that he took a vacation day to accompany his son on a field trip when he could have taken the day off to just chill. He smiled and said he was glad to be with this son, seeing him getting the glasses he needs. And he thanked me for providing the services.

His quiet demeanor and clear love of his family touched me deeply, and I'm so pleased CCSC had the opportunity to support his family.

A Family Legacy in Volunteering

In the early 2000s, I was standing at the volunteer check-in table for the Back To School program when a woman with a compelling smile signed in. We spoke briefly, and something inside me told me she was special, and indeed she was. Her name was Mary Lou Hall, and she was a leader in the Episcopal Church as well as the wider Houston community.

Mary Lou enjoyed her morning organizing school supplies, and over a period of time became more and more engaged in CCSC's work. She volunteered at two of our youth-serving programs, faithfully attended the Azalea Dinner, helped raise awareness and funds for our mission, and served on the Board of Directors. She also brought her grandchildren to volunteer, wanting them to experience the value of helping people in need.

Mary Lou was beloved at CCSC. Sadly, she passed away in late 2018, but her commitment to the organization lives on.

Her grandson, Philip Grove, volunteered at the food pantry when he was in high school. Today he serves on the Council of Church Representatives for his church, St. John the Divine Episcopal, ensuring the communication between CCSC and his church is strong. Philip's father, Brian Grove, currently serves as Chair of CCSC's Memorial Endowment, ensuring good stewardship over these resources.

Mary Lou's husband, Charles, often observed how much she admired and loved CCSC, its people, and its contributions to the community. She spoke of CCSC often at home and was proud to be associated with it, but was modest and self-effacing about her own contributions of time and treasure to it. And yet her impact was powerful and continues today through her family.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Christian Community Service Center (CCSC) is to serve the poor, hungry, disabled and otherwise needy while respecting their religious, ethnic or cultural differences. CCSC was created out of faith and founded in the belief that we are called to help all God's children heart to heart and hand in hand.

Why CCSC Matters



In 2018, CCSC touched lives in the following ways:

- 26,125** Clients were supplied with nutritious food packages *
- 893** Households received electricity, water, natural gas or rent assistance
- 283** Persons received medical assistance for eyeglasses, dental services or prescription medication
- 7,370** Persons were provided with gently-used clothing *
- 7,917** Pounds of produce harvested for clients at the CCSC Garden
- 461** Job-seekers gained valuable skills through workshops, computer training and personalized coaching with 30% gaining employment; 198 clients created customized development strategies with the Client Services Connector
- 231** Motivated entrepreneurs participated in a unique 42-hour vocational training program; 52 job leads were shared with graduates
- 6,502** Students started the academic year with new school supplies and school attire
- 2,865** Children received new toys, books and family food packages for Christmas
- 1,458** Students received vision screening; 494 were provided professional eye exams with 449 receiving new prescription glasses

Hurricane Harvey

CCSC helped clients with personal “storms” throughout 2018, yet also continued to lend special aid for community residents impacted by 2017’s Hurricane Harvey. For those who lost wages, jobs, homes and more, CCSC provided increased dollars for rent and utility assistance, blankets, extra academic supplies, dental hygiene kits, vouchers for families to buy new clothes, and connections to other community resources that assist with long-term recovery. CCSC was grateful to donors and volunteers who generously provided for this response.

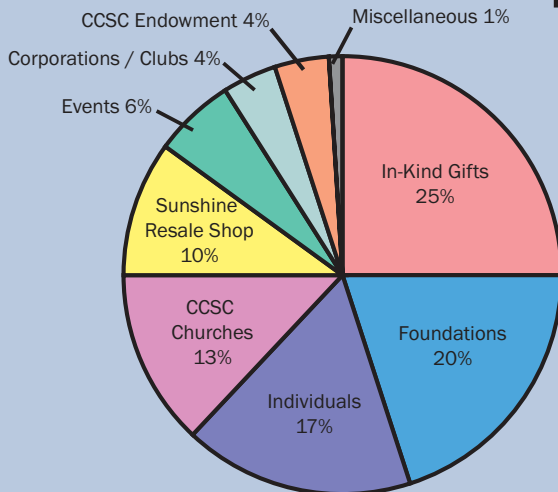


Volunteer Impact

Volunteers provide the strength of CCSC. Without them, the organization could not achieve its mission. Whether greeting clients, sorting donations at the shop, teaching computer skills, screening students’ vision or serving on a committee, the work of each CCSC volunteer makes an important difference in the community.

In 2018, 1,926 unduplicated volunteers contributed 42,962 hours across CCSC. Of those, 379 unduplicated persons were involved in ongoing roles. In the state of Texas, the estimated value of these donated hours is \$1,058,583, yet the impact of those hours is priceless.

Development



Funding Sources (unaudited)

Funds generated by sales at the Sunshine Resale Shop help support the mission of CCSC. In 2018, sales of donated items netted \$7,779, allowing more clients to be served through CCSC programs.

CCSC held two events this year to raise funds and increase community relationships: *The Azalea Dinner* in the spring and *Grow, Gather & Give!* in the fall.

Continued from its launch in 2017, CCSC’s building campaign succeeded in raising funds that will undergird future growth for the mission (numbers not reflected in this report). Our organization intentionally maintains diverse funding streams, as noted in the adjacent chart.

About Us

The **Christian Community Service Center (CCSC)** is a coalition of churches working to reduce the effects of poverty in the local community. Our Christ-centered ministry accomplishes this through various resources: volunteerism, in-kind donations, operating a resale shop, and cash donations from the private, nongovernmental sector to include church, individual, foundation and corporate support.

The ministry's focus is to apply core business principles to the accomplishment of its mission so the agency is returning value to the community in an efficient and effective manner.

How We Help

Basic Needs 10,772 unduplicated persons served
CCSC provides community members in crisis immediate relief with everyday necessities. **Emergency Services-Central** and **Emergency Services-Southwest** offer food, clothing, hygiene items and financial assistance, helping our neighbors avoid homelessness and substandard living conditions.

Employment 686 unduplicated persons served
Our organization invests in individuals interested in reaching self-reliance through hard work. **JobNet** prepares motivated job seekers through job readiness coaching and employment services. **Martha's Way** cultivates talented entrepreneurs through hands-on vocational training and job leads.

Youth Services 10,825 children served
CCSC supports children and teens, one of the most vulnerable populations. **Back To School** promotes academic preparedness; **Jingle Bell Express** addresses play, literacy and hunger; and the **Louise J. Moran Vision Care Program** provides vision-related services to underprivileged students.

A Client Story

Grace was homeless and sleeping in her truck when she discovered Emergency Services-Southwest in March. This 60-year-old traveling nurse moved to Houston from California in 2017 on a patient assignment. When that job ended, she took a break from work to help care for a disabled veteran friend, but her resources quickly ran out and her stress level had peaked. She sought out food from CCSC, yet accessed so much more on that first visit: a blanket, a hygiene kit and—most importantly—encouragement to visit our JobNet program.

Eleven days later, Grace was not only accessing the computer classes and employment resources at JobNet, but she started meeting regularly with our Client Services Connector. Together, they developed an action plan to tear down the financial, physical and emotional barriers she faced. Grace attended job search workshops and computer classes. She created a new resume, accessed career clothing and attended job fairs. She found the resources to repair her truck, acquire a Texas driver's license and revalidate her nursing license. Her confidence grew and her stress decreased after acquiring part-time work in the summer.

By September, Grace had found a full-time nursing position in a substance abuse hospital where she earned \$36 per hour. She has a safe place to live close to her job, reconnected with her adult children and feels proud to have overcome the life obstacles that once threatened her.

A native Texan, Jo Ann and her husband Bob have two grown daughters and three grandchildren. She has served in a number of leadership positions at her church including serving on

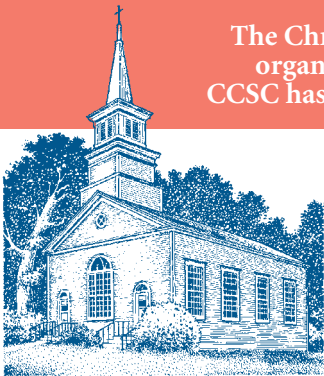
the Executive Board and seven years as Faith House Board President, a church ministry providing low-cost housing to visiting Texas Medical Center families.

EMERGENCY SERVICES—CENTRAL



One of the great joys of working at CCSC is witnessing the thoughtful, generous donations continually brought in by member churches and community organizations. EMERGENCY SERVICES—SOUTHWEST

Last year, Emergency Services-Southwest provided groceries to 1,520 families in crisis. These diverse households included persons ranging from infancy to age 101, and 43% of those served were children. Many parents who visited our Sharpstown-area site brought their children with them. Luisa and her daughter, Itzel (pictured) are one of the families helped in 2018. While they waited to receive their customized grocery package, Luisa took the opportunity to show her daughter the freshly-picked mint harvested from the CCSC Garden. We are grateful to have the resources to provide nutritional food packages and produce to those in need.



JINGLE BELL EXPRESS



Abundant smiles were clearly visible during Christian Community Service Center's 39th Jingle Bell Express program on December 7 and 8, 2018. In the spirit of the Christmas season, CCSC member churches, local individuals and big hearted organizations came together with donations and volunteer support. As a result, we served more children than our targeted goal:

- 2,865 children (infancy through age 15) received new toys, books, wooden toys and stocking stuffers—all hand-selected by their parents.
- Their 949 families received holiday food packages.
- More than 700 volunteers served at the registration, set up and distribution phases of Jingle Bell Express.

Many thanks to the Jingle Bell Express volunteer committee for its dedication and leadership; to our gracious host site Bellaire United Methodist Church; to the St. Luke's United Methodist Church Woodshop for providing handmade wooden toys; to Fiesta Mart Supermarkets for its generous food donation; and to the churches, schools, businesses and community groups that held donation drives and provided 2,500 plus hours of volunteer support!
